Makar Sankranti is a Hindu festival that is celebrated annually in India and Nepal. It is also known as the festival of harvest, and marks the beginning of the harvest season in the country. The festival is observed on January 14th every year, or sometimes on January 15th, depending on the Hindu calendar. Makar Sankranti is one of the most important festivals in the Hindu calendar, and is celebrated with great enthusiasm and fervour across the country. The festival is dedicated to the Sun God, and is believed to mark the transition of the Sun into the zodiac sign of Capricorn (Makar Rashi) on its celestial path. Expressing gratitude: Makar Sankranti is a time to express gratitude for the harvest and offer thanks to the gods for a good crop.

Strengthening social bonds: The festival is an opportunity for people to come together, exchange sweets, and strengthen social bonds.

The students of F.Y.B. Ed of 'Royal College of Education and Research for Women' organized 'Makar Sankranti' celebration on 14th January, 2023. The day began with a morning prayer, prayer song followed with a lightening of lamp.
