Additionally, participants were given different rooms for different competitions. All competitions were finished by 5pm. Afterwards, all the participants gathered and an award ceremony was held. Speeches were again held by Principal of the host college, visiting university officials and guests. The event was well planned and successfully executed.

Apart from that, student managers, both participated in two competitions out of five which were Powada Singing and Street Play. Competitions were held and our students received 2 prizes- 1st for Poster making and consolation prize for Elocution competition.

**REPORT ON DLLE- INDUSTRY ORIENTED
PROJECT**

In August 2020, our college started a collaboration with DLLE. After the official announcement of the merger between our college and DLLE, Student managers were selected. Sayed Khushnuma and Asma Ansari were appointed as student managers of the DLLE program. After that we attended a DLLE First term Training Program, where all the details of the extension program were explained and 6 project topics were given from which we had to choose one and the topic we chose was Industry Oriented Project (IOP).

After that, we had our first term training program for all the students at our college on November 4, 2022, where our field coordinator, Dr. Shirley Agwuocha ma'am, gave us the details about the selected project. The class was divided into five groups of 9-10 members and each group was sent to a different school for training from 14.11.2022 for Internship. The students were instructed to carry out various activities during internship (school) namely talk on millets, co-curricular activity, art, lessons, attendance, cleanliness training, health talks, women empowerment etc. The interns did various activities in schools during the specified period, the training ended on 03.02.2023.

As we announced about the DLLE program students were perplexed with how the activities have to be conducted. How and what is needed to carry out the activities. However with instructions from the internship in-charge teachers, students were able to understand the aim and objective of the activities. After going to the internship schools it was very difficult for some trainees to get permission from the school authorities to conduct classroom activities, but in some schools it was granted without problems. These activities really gave the students a sense of confidence as the activities were related to empowerment, self-confidence, health talk, cleanliness and other aspects.

On 4th November, 2022, we had First term training program of DLLE (Department of lifelong learning and extension) to orient the students about the program selected-IOP. The programme commenced through a welcome speech given by DLLE student manager namely, Ms. .Asma followed by the University anthem. Students were introduced to our field coordinator Dr. Shirley Agwuocha ma'am who enlightened us about the first term training program.

Our principal Mam Dr. Judy Grace Andrews felicitated her with few handmade items made by our students and addressed the class with an introduction about the DLLE program followed by which, Dr. Shirley Agwuocha ma'am briefed them about the DLLE program in detail.

Firstly, she informed about the duration of time the students need to spend for the DLLE program that is, 240 hours. Mani Bhavan and Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj Vastu Sangrahalaya (Prince of Wales Museum)

An educational tour was organized by our college to two of the famous places in Mumbai - that is Mani Bhavan and Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj Vastu Sangrahalaya, earlier known as Prince of Wales Museum on 15th Oct 2022. After the train journey, all assembled near the Grant road ticket counter where attendance was taken at sharp 10:30 am. After the attendance we reached our first destination i.e Mani bhavan- the library was located on the ground floor itself. Each subject was given different section in the library. The library also had pictures of Gandhiji and there were some photo frames quotes given by Gandhiji. After having a look at the library students were told us to move on to the second floor. On the second floor to the left-hand side, there was a picture depicting Gandhiji's life. In another room there were items he used when he was in jail, also there was a pic of a letter written by Gandhiji himself, on the same floor students were taken to a room where they were shown a 20 mins movie on Gandhiji. The patriotic movie showed love, pride for nation and also encouraged people to stand by their countries and reinforced a sense of national belonging towards their nation. After the movie students were taken to the next floor where there were stories of Gandhiji's life depicted in the form of models. Later students were told to take a one-hour lunch break and asked us to report to the Prince of Wales Museum at sharp 1:30 p.m. Once all of us reached the gate, attendance was taken again and then we entered the museum. Each floor had several galleries and each had their own specifications. On the second floor we went to the painting gallery. After the tour we all assembled in the hall and picture of our group was taken.
