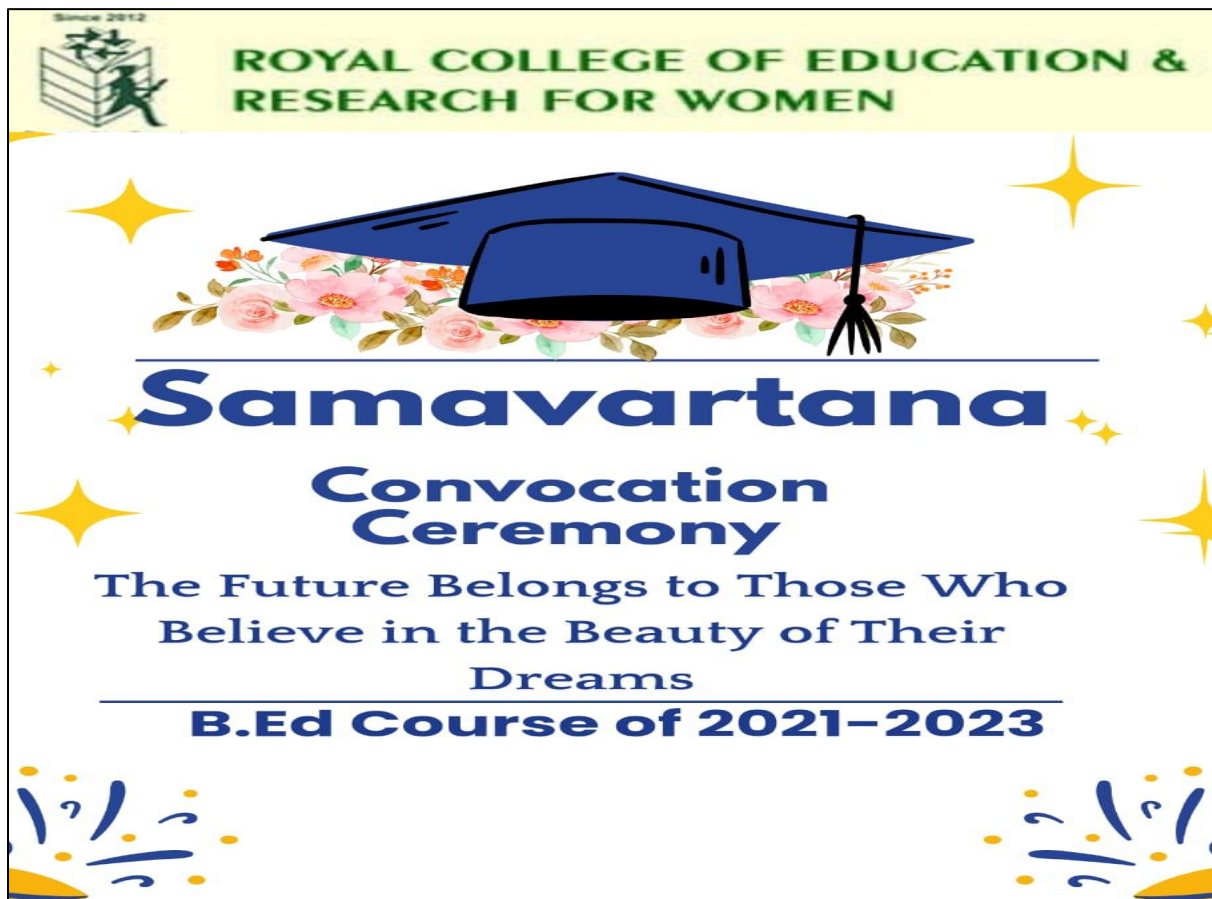

Ms. Shifa: The thoughtful involvement of students and dignitaries showcased a strong sense of community and teamwork.

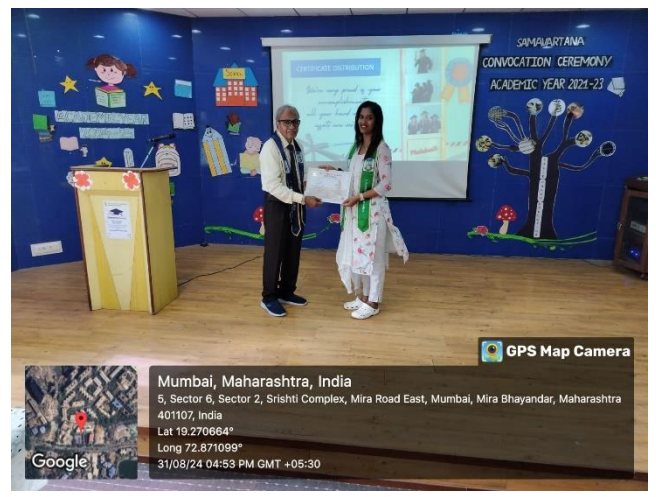
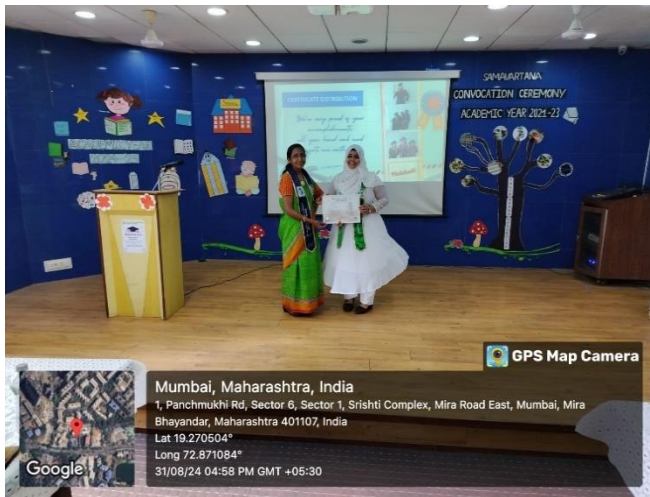
