### **Objectives:**

- To promote the importance of language as a tool for connection and understanding.

### **Reflection:**

The Literary Club of Royal College of Education and Research for Women organized an activity on the theme “Many Languages, One Emotion” on 20th April 2026 in the Multipurpose Hall. The program began with a warm welcome followed by a short introduction to the theme. A thought-provoking opening highlighted the idea that feelings like love, happiness, respect, and unity are understood across all cultures and languages.

The event included a variety of engaging activities. The first was a group activity, ‘Story chain in Multiple Languages’, for this the class was divided equally in two groups. A starting line to a story was provided according to which both the groups were to complete the story in their own way. The catch was that each member of the group was to write 2-3 sentences to complete the story in their mother tongue or any other Indian language. Both the groups made creative and unique stories and presented it in front of the class.

The second segment was a competition named ‘Poetry Across Languages’. In this a Hindi poem on Trees was displayed and the participants were to translate the poem into English while maintaining the main crux and rhythm of the original poem. It was time bound and so the participants were hurrying to make a poem with rhymes and meter. Yet when everyone presented their poems, each of them was as unique as the previous one.

The third and the last segment was another competition named ‘Synonym Showdown’. This was again a time bound competition where 10 words were displayed on the projector and the participants were to write as much synonyms of each of the words as possible while also making one sentence each for the ten words. This activity really made every participant scratch their brains.

The day ended with the teacher incharges appreciating all the participants for their creativity. Overall the event was very interactive and made everyone more connected to their literature and culture.

## Learning Outcomes:

- Students understood the concept of unity in diversity through languages.
- Developed respect and appreciation for different languages and cultures.
- Improved communication and presentation skills.
- Enhanced confidence through active participation.
- Learned that emotions are universal and connect people beyond language barriers.

## Conclusion:

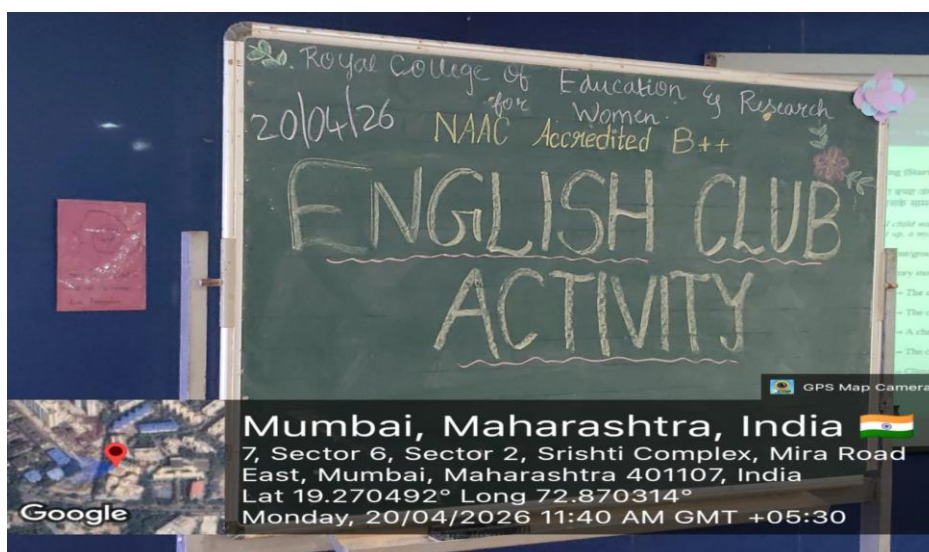

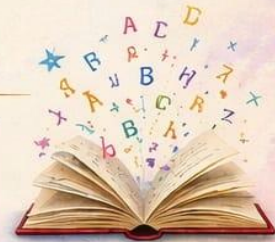

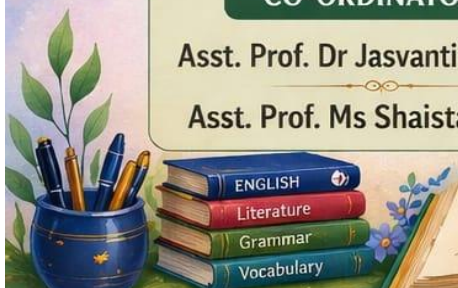
